Nordic Walking has many health benefits by improving posture, mobility, stability and strength through full body engagement and can aid recovery after surgery and stroke recovery and benefit sufferers of arthritis and Parkinson's. It uses 90% of our muscles while, at the same time, reducing joint strain. It also provides opportunities for social interaction and is considered to be a safe activity for seniors. At the end of the course, there could be opportunities to organise group walks.
